Where did we start and where do we stand now?

- November 2007: start of TURI project
- 14 February 2008, Brussels: inauguration of TURI network by its initial members - 25 TURIs from 16 European countries
- April 2008: first meeting of TURI Advisory Board
- July 2008: the TURI website has been put online
- 14-15 October 2008, Brussels: first TURI conference 'The Future of Trade Union Structures and Strategies' and workshop 'Establishing a Research Agenda on Climate Change and Trade Unions'
- December 2008: first seminar on the financial and economic crisis
- March 2008: survey sent out which should serve as a basis of a joint TURI report on the national stimulus packages

- January 2009: first call for candidates for the TURI mobility support, participating institutes: ETUI (Brussels), OSE (Brussels), IRES (Paris), LRD (London), Fundacion 1° de Mayo (Madrid), Sindnova (Rome), IRES Rome (Rome), Hans Böckler Stiftung (Düsseldorf), WSI (Düsseldorf) and IMK (Düsseldorf)
- 29 June 2009: second seminar on the financial and economic crisis 'European responses to the crisis and alternatives to GDP as an element of a paradigm shift'
- 4-5 May 2010: second TURI conference in Madrid: 'The implications of the crisis for the labour market', in cooperation with Fundación 1° de Mayo and Fundación Francisco Largo Caballero
- The discussion started at this conference led to the establishment of a TURI Working Group on Wages and Collective Bargaining. This idea, launched by WSI, resulted in a first meeting in Brussels on 22 March 2011, attended by representatives of over 20 TURI Institutes.

- 13-14 May 2011: 3rd annual TURI conference in Athens, hosted by the Labour Institute of the Greek General Confederation (INE/GSEE – ADEDY). At the ETUC Congress some of the TURI members made use of the exhibition space provided at the ETUI stand in the exhibition hall to promote their publications.
- August 2011: The joint project proposal Collectively agreed wages in Europe (CAWIE) was submitted under the EU Budget line 04.03.03.01 Industrial relations and social dialogue in August 2011.
- 7 - 8 June 2012: 4th annual conference in Paris, hosted by Institut de Recherches Economiques et Sociales (IRES)
- 21 - 22 March 2013: 5th annual conference in Rome, hosted by IRES, CESOS and EURISPES
- 23 - 24 June 2014: 6th annual conference in Sofia, hosted by ISTUR and ISETUR

- February 2015: update round of the TURI website
- 1 - 2 June 2015: 7th annual conference in Amsterdam, hosted by the Amsterdam Institute for Advanced Labour Studies (AIAS) and the Scientific Bureau for the trade union movement 'De Burcht'
- 11 - 13 May 2016: 8th annual conference in Sesimbra (Lisbon), in cooperation with the Centre for Social Studies (CES) of the University of Coimbra and the Instituto Ruben Rolo (IRR) and with the support of the Friedrich Ebert Foundation in Portugal and Montepio Geral – Associação Mutualista
- 17-19 May 2017, London: 9th annual conference with host partner the Labour Research Department
- February 2018 - the TURI website has been transferred to the ETUI web portal and at the same time a new round of member profile updates has taken place
